Show Organising Committee

Use of the Defibrillator in the event of a Suspected Cardiac Arrest

If only you and the victim are present:

Place victim on their back and ensure breathing passages in nose and mouth are clear.

Remove any tightfitting clothing around throat and chest..

Commence CPR as quickly as possible.

Ring for Ambulance 999.

Continue CPR until "First responders" arrive

If you have a third person with you;

Do all the above but also ask for the Code to open the box containing the Defibrillator situated on Front Street, Lockington at Location AAH77

One of you continues CPR.

Your colleague collects the Defib as quickly as possible.

On return follow instructions on Defib.

Please note from the above. CPR is the most important procedure for a victim. The Defib should only be obtained if there is a third person available to help.

PLEASE RECORD THE LOCATION AAH77. (IT WILL AVOID YOU HAVING TO MAKE ANOTHER PHONE CALL ON ARRIVAL AT THE PHONE BOX)

CPR - As can be seen from the above, CPR is the first and most important action to take.

If you are not familiar with how to do CPR, contact the Red Cross or visit one of the many instruction courses online or on youtube.
